## Vs 18

As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, He saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen.

Vs 19-20

"Come, follow me," Jesus said,  
"and I will make you fishers of  
men." At once they left their  
nets and followed Him.

Vs 23

Jesus went throughout Galilee,  
teaching in their synagogues

*Synagogue:  
together - I - bring*

## Vs 24

News about Him spread all over Syria, and people brought to Him all who were ill with various diseases, those suffering severe pain, the demon-possessed, those having seizures, and the paralyzed, and He healed them.

## Vs 25

Large crowds from Galilee, the Decapolis, Jerusalem, Judea and the region across the Jordan followed Him.

# Matthew 5

## Vs 1-2

Now when He saw the crowds,  
He went up on a mountainside  
and sat down. His disciples  
came to Him, and He began to  
teach them, saying:

I think Jesus is saying  
“This call to be my followers is  
bigger than you know”

At times it will be

- Terrifying - and you will be tempted to run

- Daunting - and you will be tempted to give up

- Invigorating that you cannot imagine any other way

## Vs 1-2

Now when He saw the crowds,  
He went up on a mountainside  
and sat down. His disciples

"Blessed are the poor in spirit,  
for theirs is the kingdom of  
heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn,  
for they will be comforted.

2 Corinthians 7:10

Blessed are the pure in heart,  
for they will see God.

responsibility of seeing you

Vs 9

Blessed are the peacemakers,  
for they will be called sons of  
God.




LORD, I accept the ability  
to bring reconciliation

Vs 10

Blessed are those who are  
persecuted because of  
righteousness, for theirs is the  
kingdom of heaven.
